The COVID-19 pandemic has placed an unprecedented strain on the aged care and disability support workforce. A new skill set – *CHCCS00114 Entry into Care Roles Skill Set* – has been developed in response to COVID-19 by the Federal Government.

Skill Set Units include:

- CHCCCS015** Provide individualised support
HLTINF001 Comply with infection prevention and control policies and procedures
HLTWHS002 Follow safe work practices for direct client care (including 1-week workplace training)

The good news is that the Certificate III in Individual Support incorporates those three units and you will complete them at the beginning of your course. Therefore, you will be able to seek employment under this scheme in approximately 3 weeks.

This skill set is not designed to replace the Certificate III in Individual Support, but rather to meet an immediate industry need, and is considered valid until 30 June 2021.

If your priority is to get a job in the most sought-after industry, this is the course for you.

Course overview

The Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing, Home and Community) course provides you with a holistic approach to caring for the older people within our community.

This course is designed to equip you to provide physical and social support to elderly individuals and people in hostels, group homes and community settings. The course also aims to provide you with the knowledge, skills and values required to perform competently as professional Health Care Workers. The course structure is designed to ensure a balance between theory and practice.

Course outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course, you will be exempted 3 units in Diploma of Nursing at Stott's.

Occupational titles for graduates with this qualification may include:

- Personal Care Assistant
- Nursing Support Worker
- Assistant in Nursing (AIN)
- Aged or Disabled Care Worker
- Community Care Worker
- Support Worker
