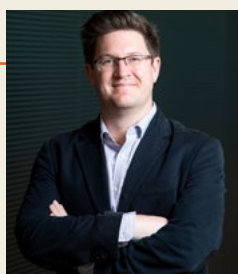

Executive Dean, Health and Education

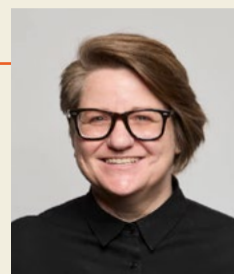

FUNDING YOUR FUTURE

Education is an investment in yourself – here's how FEE-HELP and scholarships can support your studies.

WHAT IS FEE-HELP?

FEE-HELP is a government loan scheme that helps eligible students pay their tuition fees. Most domestic students can use FEE-HELP to cover some or all of their course costs. Repayments only start when your income rises above a set threshold, and are made automatically through the tax system.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR FEE-HELP?

After you receive an offer and meet the eligibility requirements, complete a Commonwealth Assistance Form (CAF) to access FEE-HELP. You'll need a Tax File Number or Certificate of Application for a Tax File Number, and must submit the form by the due date.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR A VET STUDENT LOAN?

If you're enrolling in a VET course and are eligible, you may apply for a VET Student Loan (VSL) to help cover your tuition fees. You'll need to complete a Commonwealth Assistance Form (CAF) and provide a Tax File Number or a Certificate of Application for a Tax File Number before the deadline.

AM I ELIGIBLE?

You may be eligible for FEE-HELP if:

- You are studying with an approved provider (like Torrens University).
- You meet citizenship and residency requirements. This includes:
 - Australian citizens, or
 - New Zealand Special Category visa holders who meet the long-term residency requirements and are undertaking at least one unit of study in Australia, or
 - Permanent humanitarian visa holders who will reside in Australia for their studies, or
 - Permanent visa holders undertaking bridging study for overseas trained professionals, residing in Australia for the duration of their course.
- You are enrolled in an eligible unit of study by the census date.
- You have not exceeded the FEE-HELP limit.

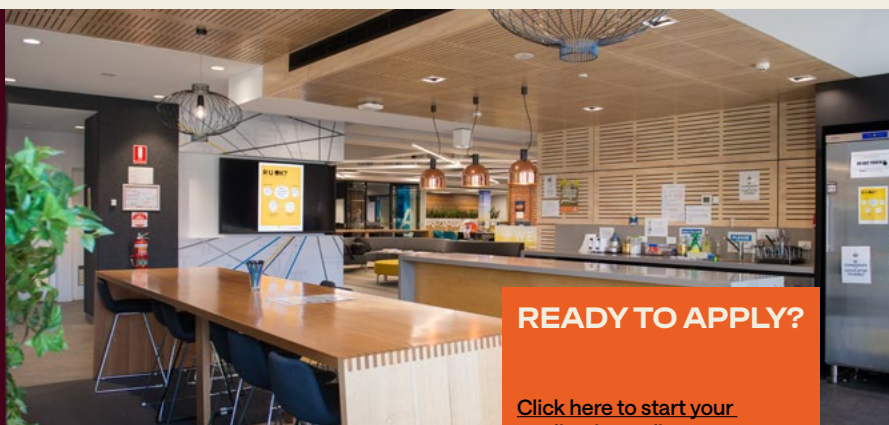
