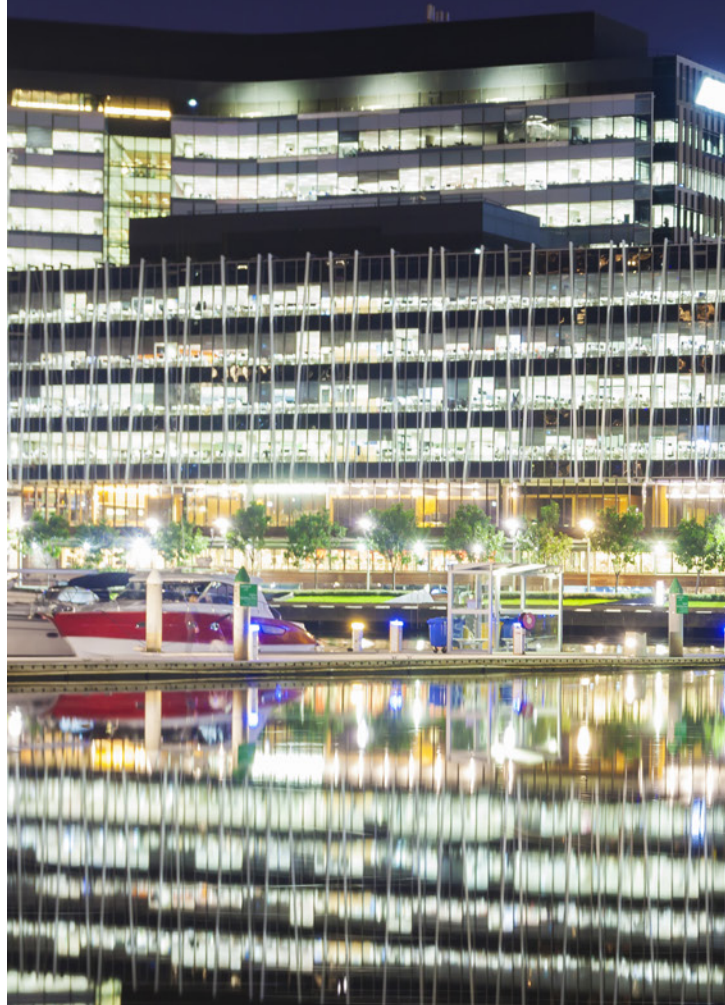

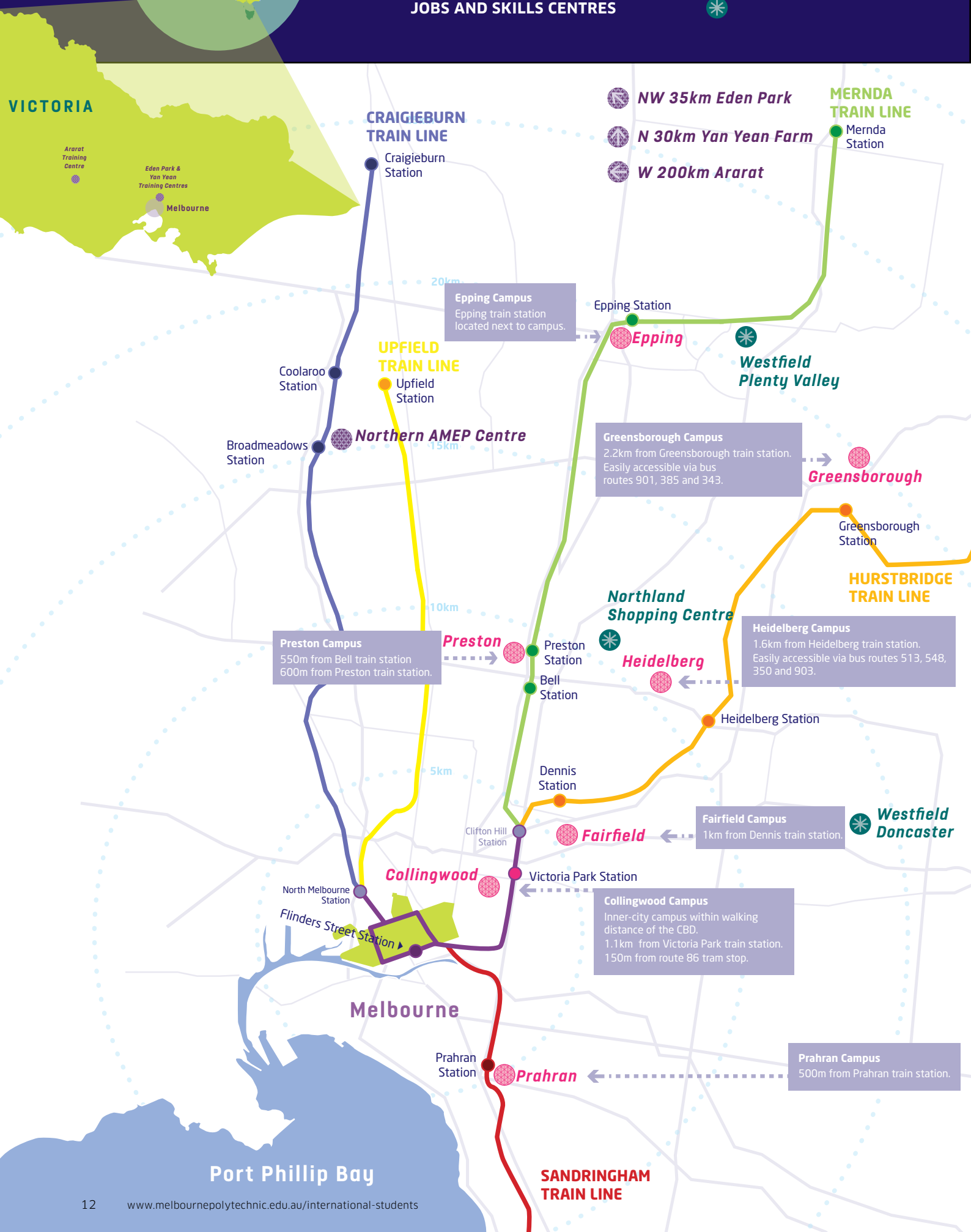

Living Costs

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

International Students

An International Student is defined as a student who holds a Student Visa as defined in the *Education Services for Overseas Students Act 2000* (ESOS Act). These students will enrol via the International Office and pay International Course Fees.

Note: International students who do not hold a Student Visa are deemed to be 'Ineligible students' and will pay course fees which apply to that cohort.

Academic Level

Melbourne Polytechnic requires the successful completion of studies equivalent to Australian Year 12 education as the minimum level of entry into most certificate, diploma and degree courses. For a full list of Australian equivalencies for International Students, please visit www.melbournepolytechnic.edu.au/international-students/admissions-information/australian-equivalencies-international

In some cases, if you do not meet Melbourne Polytechnic's academic entry-level requirements but have acquired skills or knowledge relevant to your chosen course, you may apply as a mature age student. Students over 18 years of age who have been out of full-time education for at least one year are considered mature age students.

English Proficiency

All international student applicants must demonstrate a sufficient level of English language proficiency in accordance with each course's English language entry requirements as stated below. Other evidence of English proficiency may be accepted in individual cases upon submission of appropriate documentation.

Applicants must provide evidence of satisfactory completion of **one** of the following completed no more than two years prior to the date of application unless otherwise specified.

1. Previous Australian studies where English was the only language of instruction:

- I. Australian Senior Secondary Certificate of Education (Australian Year 12)
- II. Australian Foundation Course
- III. Certificate IV or higher Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) qualification
- IV. Bachelor degree or higher AQF qualification - two subject passes within the last two years
- V. Bachelor degree or higher AQF qualification - at least one academic year completion within the last four years.

Note: Students completing Melbourne Polytechnic programs delivered in People's Republic of China, Hong Kong (SAR of China) and Republic of Korea, where instruction is not entirely in English, may undertake the Versant English Placement Test to demonstrate they have achieved an adequate level of English language proficiency for their chosen course of study.

2. Previous studies in a specified English-speaking country where English was the only language of instruction:

- I. Secondary studies equivalent to Australian Year 12
- II. Post-secondary studies, equivalent to one academic year at an Australian Certificate IV or higher level.

* **English-speaking countries:** Australia, New Zealand, United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland, United States of America, Canada, South Africa. No time limit applies if the student has resided in an English-speaking country since completion of these studies.

5. Versant English Placement Test (VEPT)

Melbourne Polytechnic offers the Versant English Placement Test (VEPT), which is a computerised English placement test for eligible applicants.

The VEPT is not a form of English proficiency acceptable for direct entry into Higher Education programs, but it can be used for entry into Melbourne Polytechnic's English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) program as a package.

Please contact the International Office to find out if you are eligible for this free test.

6. English language proficiency requirements for student visas

Depending on the applicant's country of citizenship and intended course of study, evidence of a suitable level of English language proficiency may be required for a student visa application. This requirement is separate to Melbourne Polytechnic, although applicants will still be required to demonstrate that they have or will meet the student visa English language skills eligibility requirement before unconditional entry is granted. International Students Under 18 Years of Age

Melbourne Polytechnic will only admit international students under the age of 18 where:

- › appropriate accommodation and welfare arrangements are in place prior to applying for a student visa;
- › the arrangements are approved by Melbourne Polytechnic; and
- › the arrangements are in place for the duration of the period of enrolment plus seven days or until the student turns 18.

Education Agents

Melbourne Polytechnic works closely with agents in Australia and around the world to ensure that international students receive relevant and accurate information regarding courses and visas before they arrive in Australia.

Genuine Temporary Entrant Requirements

In late 2011, the Department of Home Affairs (DHA) (previously the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP)) implemented a 'genuine temporary entrant' or 'GTE' requirement to ensure the Australian Student Visa Programme is used as intended. In addition to meeting course selection criteria, international student applicants for Melbourne Polytechnic courses may be required to provide additional documentation and information to demonstrate that the applicant will have sufficient financial capacity to support their study and stay in Australia and that they are a genuine student and a genuine temporary entrant to Australia. How to Apply

Melbourne Polytechnic International does not charge an initial application fee. We will be the single point of contact for all your queries and will respond quickly when processing your application.

Applications can be submitted direct to Melbourne Polytechnic International (by mail, email or in person) or through an authorised education agent.



APPLYING FOR ACADEMIC CREDIT AND/OR SKILLS RECOGNITION

International students may apply for, and be granted, Academic Credit and/or Skills Recognition towards any Melbourne Polytechnic course.

Forms of Academic Credit and Skills Recognition:

- › **Credit Transfer** – credit given for successfully completed formal learning that is equivalent in content and learning outcomes.
- › **Recognition of Prior Learning** – credit given based on learning gained from experience in the workplace, in voluntary work, in social or domestic activities, or through informal or formal training.

You may be eligible to complete your course earlier if you are granted a sufficient amount of Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning. If eligible, Melbourne Polytechnic will amend your offer letter, payment schedule and/or your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) to reflect the revised scheduled course duration resulting from the credit you are eligible to receive.

There are two types of assessment for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning:

1. **Preliminary Assessment** – prior to enrolment and requested upon submission of an application. This is an assessment to determine your eligibility for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning.
2. **Official Assessment** – upon class enrolment. This is the process to apply, accept and be granted the Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning you are eligible for in accordance with the Institute's official credit policies and procedures. Please note that once the official assessment is successful, it may take several weeks for your Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning to be finalised.

The steps for applying for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning:

Applying for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning BEFORE the Course Commencement Date:

STEP 1

When completing the Melbourne Polytechnic International Student Application Form, please fill out the relevant section with your request for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning.

STEP 2

Ensure you provide the following documents along with your Application Form:

- › Passport photo pages.
- › Academic transcripts or results.
- › Course or unit outlines/course syllabus.
- › Evidence of course/unit enrolments (where you are seeking Credit Transfer for studies not yet completed).
- › If applying for Recognition of Prior Learning due to relevant working experience, please include any documentation that will support your Recognition of Prior Learning application, such as a curriculum vitae or detailed employer reference. You may also supply a personal statement to support your application and explain how your experience aligns with the course for which you are seeking Recognition of Prior Learning.

All documents must be in English. English translations must be done by a professional translation organisation such as a NAATI accredited translator and a certified copy of the original documents must be provided with the certified translation.

If your studies were completed at Melbourne Polytechnic, no formal documentation will be required.

STEP 3

Submit your complete application via email, in person, post or through your agent as per the details on the International Student Application Form (pages 80–84).

Please allow 10–15 working days for Melbourne Polytechnic to assess your application and issue an offer letter and acceptance agreement.

Applying for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning AFTER the Course Commencement Date:

If you wish to apply for Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning after you have commenced the course, please discuss this directly with your teaching department and, if your request is successful, you will be informed of the outcome of your request.

What can I do if I am dissatisfied with the Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning assessment?

Make an appointment with the Program Leader who did the Credit Transfer and/or Recognition of Prior Learning assessment to discuss.

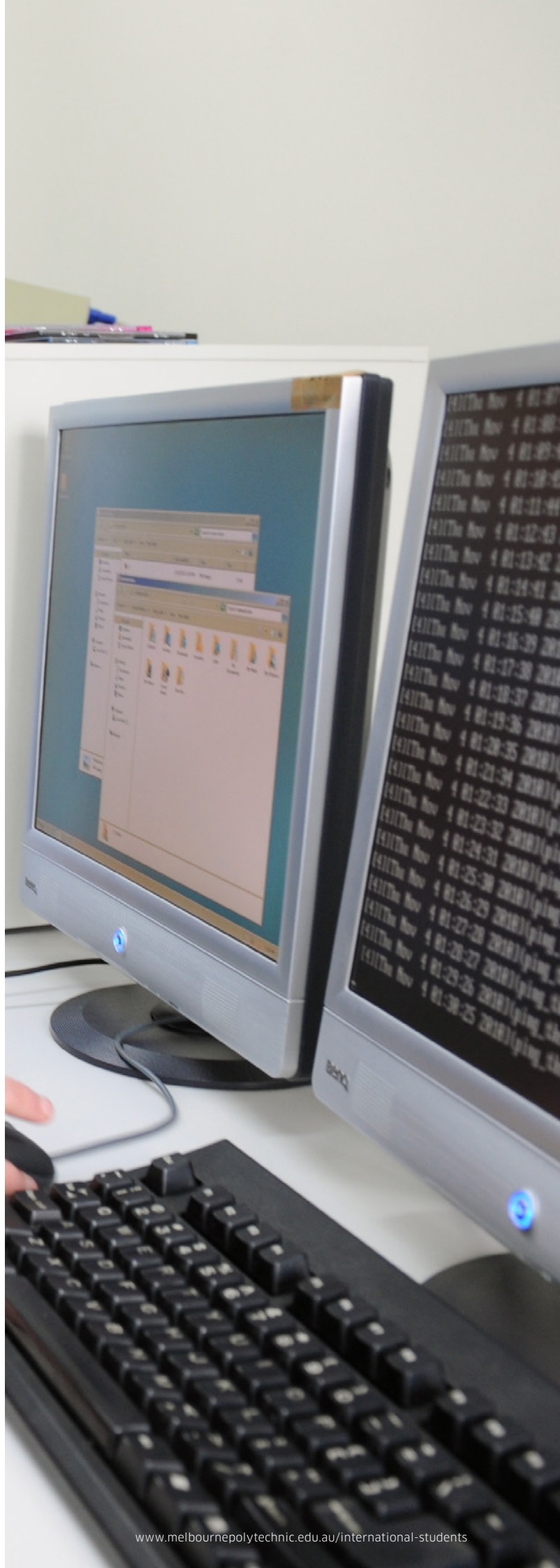

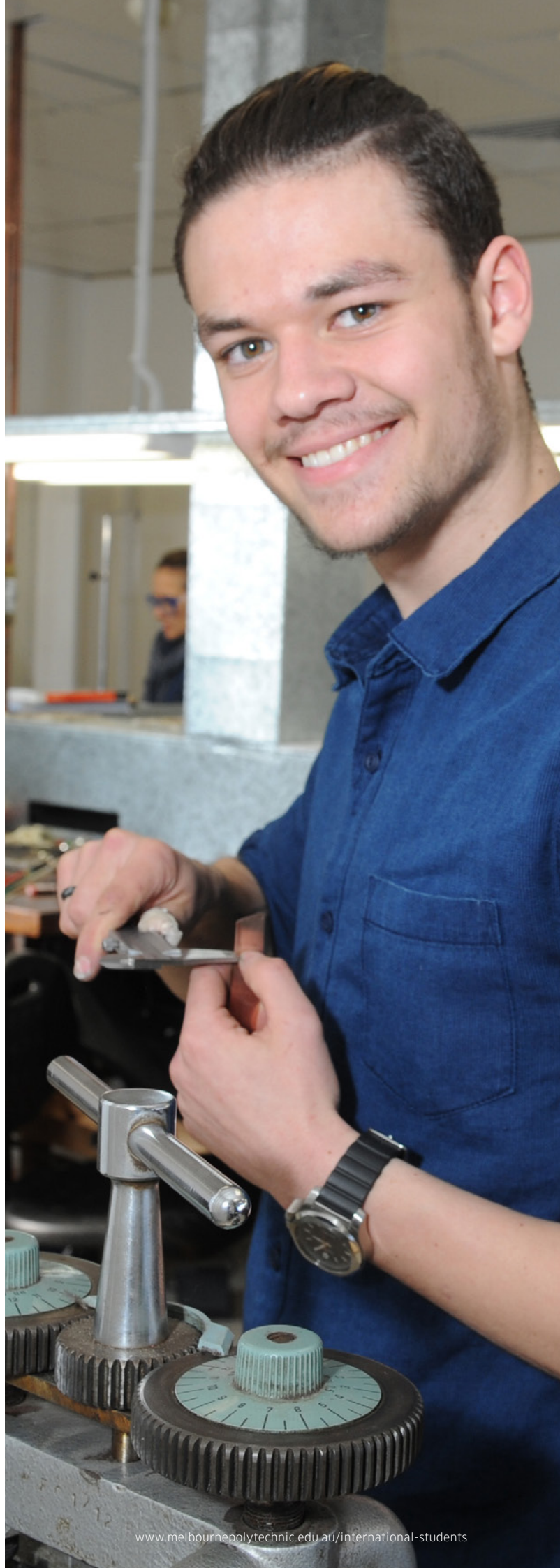

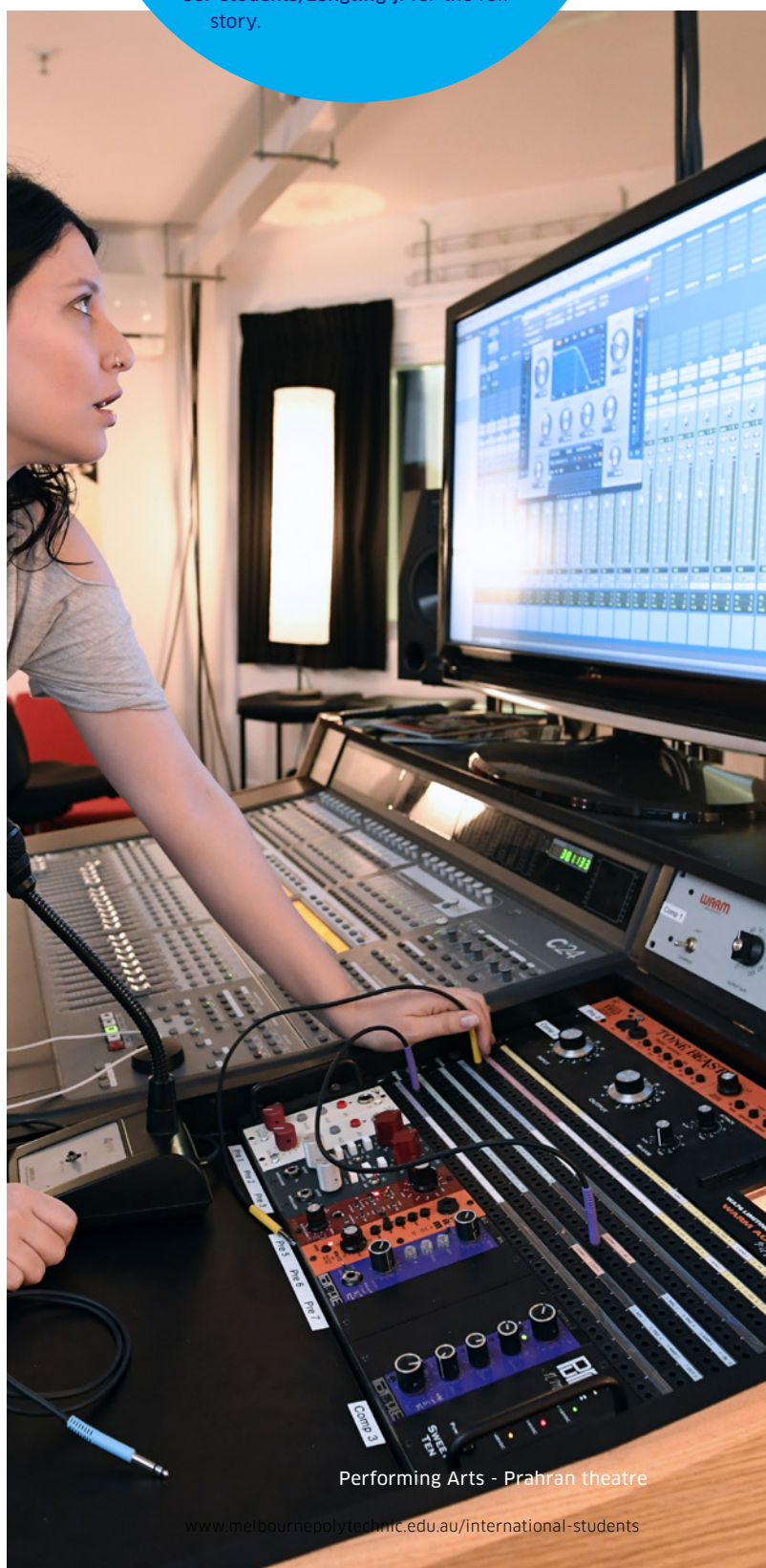
